
In addition, we announced the launch of a senior skills-based sponsorship program, which marks a new stage in the Group's philanthropic and social commitment.

2022/2023 Highlights

FRANCE — November 1, 2022

Mécénat Servier signs a partnership agreement with the *Association pour l'Amitié (APA)*, donating €80,000 to support the creation of a new solidarity-based intergenerational co-living space in the 14th district of Paris.

UKRAINE — December 12, 2022

The Servier Group announces a donation of €12 million for humanitarian action in Ukraine via the Mécénat Servier Charity Fund.

TURKEY — July 20, 2023

In the aftermath of the devastating earthquakes in February 2023, the Servier Group announces a donation of €500,000 to Mécénat Servier earmarked for building a community center in Turkey with **Needs Map**.

UKRAINE — September 2023

Mécénat Servier donated €118,214.14 to *Protection Civile* for the purchase of two used vehicles, the creation of a mobile telemedicine service in Medvyn and the supply of a bone densitometer to the trauma hospital in Kharkiv. A donation of €157,458 was also made to *KRONA* for the purchase of a panoramic tissue scanner at Okhmatdyt Children's Hospital in Kiev.



Solidarity, in all circumstances

Mécénat Servier was created in 2016 with the desire to gather together the Servier Group's solidarity initiatives in France and internationally and to develop them over time to make a sizable, enduring impact. In 2022, events such as the armed conflict between Ukraine and Russia, and the earthquakes that hit Turkey, Syria and Morocco the following year, led Mécénat Servier teams to change their course of action to meet the needs of affected populations.

The responsiveness and agility of Servier and Mécénat Servier teams helped meet the initial needs of the employees and populations affected by these crises. Now, they are devoting themselves to combining long-term involvement with these initial commitments to guarantee reconstruction and support local communities.

IN THE FIRST HOURS, CARING FOR COLLEAGUES AND THEIR LOVED ONES

In the early stages of crises, Servier teams' first instinct was to get news from Group employees. Florent Darchez, General Manager at Servier Morocco, was 30 kilometers from the epicenter of the earthquake that hit the western part of the country on the night of September 8, 2023. "At midnight, everyone tried to call their relatives and colleagues, but the network was overloaded," he recalls. "We all wanted to do something, but we couldn't do anything yet," says Guillaume Recorbet, General Manager at Servier Turkey. Twenty employees were directly affected by the series of earthquakes that occurred near the border between Turkey and Syria in February 2023.

Then, the time to take action quickly followed. The day after the earthquake in Morocco, local teams got organized to collect funds and emergency supplies like blankets, tents, and clothing. In Turkey, the team set up an emergency psychological unit. In Ukraine, Nicolas Clavreul, General Manager at Servier Ukraine, believes that "the expertise of Servier's medical aid was decisive in helping to meet the population's initial needs for medicine and emergency kits."

SUPPORTING AND SUSTAINING THE WAVE OF SOLIDARITY

Very quickly, Servier employees — in Ukraine, Turkey, Morocco, and elsewhere — contacted the Group's general management and Mécénat Servier to offer their contributions. A solidarity pot was created in addition to the Solidarity Fund for Ukraine, which Servier announced would be set up in March 2022.

Collection was extended to all Servier employees around the world. This initiative was endorsed and supported by the Executive Committee, which then decided that the Group would match the amount collected. A total of €73,000 would be donated. A few months later, the amount raised spontaneously by employees in Turkey was also matched by Mécénat Servier, touched by this expression of solidarity.

These large-scale mobilizations are essential for local NGOs and organizations. For example, Esra Arslan, co-founder of **Needs Map** and member of its Board of Directors (see inset p. 9), observes that "companies can reach thousands of people with different skills in one click via emails or WhatsApp groups, which allows them to organize donations as well as groups of volunteers needed on the ground."

THE TIME TO REBUILD

“Partners, donors and volunteers are often highly motivated in times of crisis. This reaction is based on emotion. Once the emergency response has finished, it is time to rebuild. Whatever the initial crisis, it's just the beginning of the long-term work,” explains Marc-Antoine Bacot, Head of International & Humanitarian Cooperation at *Protection Civile*. Esra Arslan shares this view: “Reconstruction is a long process that continues months or even years after a disaster.”

To serve affected populations over time, Servier's teams — with the assistance of Mécénat Servier — sought to identify relevant projects to support. Their aim is to select projects that are “useful to the populations involved, with a threefold economic, therapeutic and social value,” according to Florent Darchez. In Morocco, for example, the funds collected will especially be used to build a facility to accommodate students without a school building during the reconstruction phase. It will then become a community health care center for the most vulnerable people. “In this way, we are dealing with the emergency, while contributing to long-term local development and responding to the needs expressed by the people themselves,” he adds.

In Turkey, Servier also contributed to the construction of a community center, able to accommodate nearly 500 families. Guillaume Recorbet stresses that “the work done by Needs Map to identify projects was essential for finding and helping the right organization, as many organizations were overwhelmed in the weeks following the earthquakes.” For Esra Arslan, the purpose of this center is to support “the long-term resilience and well-being of affected communities,” including “job creation and the resilience of the local supply chain.”

NEEDS MAP

Needs Map is a cooperative platform that connects people in need with the individuals and organizations that wish to support them. Since its creation in 2015, it has mobilized more than 120,000 donors, 350 NGOs, 70 private sector organizations and representatives from hundreds of public institutions.

The actions supported by Mécénat Servier in Ukraine will restore local populations' access to essential health care. "The renovation of Chernihiv Hospital, for example, will result in the provision of 23 medical specialties for a pool of over 62,000 inhabitants." Nicolas Clavreul also states that "the impact of these commitments will go further by extending the care offering to innovative medicine, for example with the creation of the neurosurgery department at the National Cancer Institute in Kiev."

SOLIDARITY IN MOTION

In the midst of these times of crisis, specific moments or encounters have left an indelible mark on Servier's teams and their local partners. Nicolas Clavreul was struck by "the dedication and enthusiasm of Volodymyr Zhovnir," the director of the Okhmatdyt Children's Hospital in Kiev. There, Mécénat Servier provided funds for a panoramic tissue scanner to detect certain cancers earlier. Marc-Antoine Bacot is delighted to have been able to "develop a public service in a remote area in record time in a country in a state of armed conflict with a foreign power" thanks to the "direct and strong cooperation between the *Fédération Nationale de Protection Civile* and Servier Ukraine for the creation of the municipal mobile telemedicine service in Medvyn."

PROTECTION CIVILE

Protection Civile is an organization that dedicates all its resources to ensuring the protection of civilian populations in both times of peace and times of crisis or war. Since 2022, *Protection Civile* has supported the Ukrainian population by sending humanitarian donations and carrying out projects in the areas of access to medical treatment and reconstruction.

Esra Arslan stresses that "Mécénat Servier's involvement after the earthquakes in Turkey enabled faster recovery efforts." During these crises, Servier's local teams, their organizational partners and, more broadly, all Group employees have expressed their commitment to solidarity in a concrete way. By acting collectively, whether through support, expertise or a personal commitment, they were able to respond to the emergency alongside affected populations while preparing for the future.

While the year 2022/2023 was particularly marked by emergency action taken in Ukraine, Turkey and Morocco, Mécénat Servier continued its work to improve access to treatment and health care, alongside its partners.

Caring is one of Servier's cardinal values. Within the Group, caring means being committed to patient health, but it also means taking care of one another through the attention and consideration given to others.

In addition, we are convinced that supporting our partners in the long term is a key factor in sustaining their actions. To this end, Mécénat Servier has renewed its commitment to long-time partners in France — *L'ENVOL*, *Le Rocher Oasis des Cités* and *La Fondation des Amis de L'Arche* — and in Senegal, where we commemorated

the 1,000th open-heart procedure at the Cuomo Cardiopaediatric Center in Dakar, with *La Chaîne de l'Espoir*.

Upon the recommendation of a former employee, who is now a pharmacist, Mécénat Servier also identified a new partner: *Association pour l'Amitié (APA)*, which brings together unhoused or isolated people and volunteers in solidarity-based co-living spaces, in order to facilitate encounters and friendship between them. Through its action, Mécénat Servier contributed to the opening of the largest solidarity-based co-living space in Paris, thus fully embodying its vision of living together.

By helping to forge lasting relationships between people, Mécénat Servier makes its commitments to living together and sharing key elements of physical and mental health a reality, and also builds foundations for a promising and sustainable future.

A “Garden of Dreams” come true

At the beginning of 2021, the [Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation](#) was awarded the joint initiatives call for projects with support from Servier Spain. Two years later, the “Garden of Dreams” opened its doors to test an innovative model aimed at improving the development and well-being of people with disabilities. Today, it is being tested in a special education setting and tomorrow, why not in hospitals and retirement homes!

How did the “Garden of Dreams” project come into being?

Thais Valero Infante: The [Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation](#) aims to improve mental health, particularly by relying on innovative methods that develop cognitive processes through sensory stimulation. Our team has been interested in therapeutic gardening for some time and we decided to talk about it with Servier Spain.

Véronique Jeanson: The Servier Spain CSR Committee is very active and committed. We were already conducting skills-based sponsorship activities with local partners. When Mécénat Servier launched the joint initiatives call for projects, we wanted to support a large-scale project and the Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation

immediately came to mind. We then started working on the project with their teams. We proposed transposing the therapeutic gardening model to special education; they identified an ideal partner, the CISEN School in Madrid, which also has a day hospital. We were able to address disability and mental health with different and innovative approaches.

What do you think are the key factors for a successful collaboration like the one between Mécénat Servier and the Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation?

Véronique: For Servier Spain teams, this type of project generates a lot of enthusiasm because it aligns completely with our values. As a result, many Servier Spain employees contributed to this project, beyond the CSR Committee, which is very involved in its design and overall supervision. During the first phase of the project, we took concrete action in the “Garden of Dreams” by planting plants, filling planters or helping to build items. In the second phase of the project, after the inauguration, we spent time

with the children, including during artistic and creative activities. It is a very soothing and inspiring place. The "Garden of Dreams" is also a resource for us. The wealth of interactions and ongoing activities are real factors for success.

Thais: One of the keys to the success of this project was its interdisciplinary nature, which promoted the transfer of knowledge through dialogue between different professions. During its first phase, more than 20 professionals — coming from the fields of architecture, agronomy, psychology, physical therapy, speech therapy and education — carried out in-depth studies of the expectations and needs of those benefiting from the garden. Servier Spain's corporate social responsibility (CSR) team supported and supervised the entire project and has also been involved in designing the activities for its volunteers.

A few months on from the "Garden of Dreams" inauguration in April 2022, what are the first lessons you learned from this project?

Thais: The "Garden of Dreams" serves to demonstrate the importance of the environment, and more specifically the impact of a healthy environment on mental health and emotional well-being. It also offers quality employment opportunities for people with disabilities. More concretely, we

have developed a tool to evaluate this type of facility for therapeutic purposes using 89 criteria, regrouped into five categories: physical activity, sensory stimulation, calm, play, and emotional learning. A few months after the inauguration of the garden, the 59 children and teenagers who received therapy in the "Garden of Dreams" (a total of 1,416 hours) are better able to regulate their emotions, and especially stress and anxiety. They show greater adaptability and better concentration.

Véronique: In addition to these impacts for beneficiaries, we also derive a number of benefits at Servier Spain in terms of commitment and pride of belonging. Any level of participation in this type of project helps to create and develop a true culture of openness and volunteerism. The "Garden of Dreams" has motivated some of our colleagues to continue their involvement in the activities of the Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation on their own time. 




THE "GARDEN OF DREAMS"

The "Garden of Dreams" is a pioneering therapeutic and sensory garden located in Madrid (Spain). It offers children and adolescents with mental disabilities an inspiring, rich, and suitable natural space. This project, operated by the [Juan XXIII Roncalli foundation](#), was proposed by Servier Spain in collaboration with its research center and production sites in the framework of the joint initiatives call for projects in October 2020. It has benefited from €100,000 in funding from Mécénat Servier and several skills-based sponsorship missions.

Mécénat Servier, the organization *La Chaîne de l'Espoir* and Fann University Hospital Center of Dakar, partners since 2016, celebrated the 1,000th open-heart procedure at the Cuomo Cardiopaediatric Center (CCPC) in Dakar, Senegal, in February 2023. Since the beginning of the partnership, more than 10,921 consultations were held at CCPC, which has become a center of excellence in cardiac surgery in Senegal and West and Central Africa.

In 2022/2023, Mécénat Servier broadened its scope of action internationally in order to play an active, positive role in the local communities where the Group operates. As a result of the joint initiatives call for projects, three new organizations were identified.

Teach For Bulgaria and **Teach For Romania**, partners of Teach For All, will train — with Mécénat Servier's support — a new generation of teachers in these two countries facing teacher shortages and high dropout rates. This will allow them to expand the learning opportunities for children from disadvantaged communities, in particular through the use of innovative teaching methods.


In Colombia, one of the Latin American countries with the highest adolescent birth rate, Mécénat Servier supports the **Juanfe foundation**, which strives to break the cycles of poverty in marginalized young mothers, improving their living conditions and building a better future for them through education.

In addition to its long-time partners, such as **ACTION ENFANCE**, **Enfants d'Asie**, **Espérance banlieues** and **Un Stage et Après**, Mécénat Servier

enthusiastically followed the rollout of the first two partnerships selected following its call for projects promoting access to culture, an essential dimension of equal opportunity.

As a result, **Art dans la Cité** was able to install three new "Illuminart" devices in hospitals this year. These innovative, educational and cultural devices allow immersive and contemplative digital works — starry skies, walks in the forest — or interactive works to be projected in health care facilities. This approach fosters enchanting new encounters between artists and young patients. Awakening children's curiosity and creativity, while promoting their learning, is also the vocation of **Fonds de dotation Culture pour l'Enfance**. During the fiscal year, 7,891 children participated in its immersive art program, in particular at the *Atelier des Lumières* in Paris.

Through its partnerships, Mécénat Servier actively contributes to promoting equal opportunity and inclusion to guarantee a better future for younger generations. ☺

In Morocco, schools rekindle hope

Second chance schools in Morocco welcome young people who have dropped out of school. Since 2006, *Enfance Maghreb Avenir* (EMA) has offered them training to help them get back up to speed and facilitate their future professional integration, especially in the hospitality and restaurant industries.

What are the main lessons learned from this project?

Najate Limet: We opened the new school in Nouasseur in November 2023 and, as for each project, we will follow up on the young people's integration for one year after their schooling is complete. This project has already borne fruit, especially for Servier employees. Happiness isn't just for those who receive, but also for those who give. The commitment of Servier Morocco employees who contributed to the project, as well as their gratitude, is a source of endless pride.

Bouchra Benyouna: The second chance school represents a glimmer of hope for young people who have encountered difficulties in their schooling.

Our commitment to a similar school, also managed by EMA, has already

brought to light the positive impact it has had on students' motivation and confidence. This first experience is what inspired our renewed support for EMA. I am convinced that stimulating educational projects offer students broader career horizons.

This initiative goes far beyond a simple academic opportunity: it is a second chance, an open door to educational reintegration. The school will serve as a springboard for their personal development, opening up valuable opportunities for more promising educational and career paths.

We are confident that their prospects will improve through this initiative.

What are the key factors of a successful collaboration like the one between Mécénat Servier and *Enfance Maghreb Avenir*?

Najate: The second chance school in Nouasseur is the second project carried out in partnership with Servier Morocco. We had already worked together on the renovation and expansion of a school, also in

ENFANCE MAGHREB AVENIR

Created in 2006, **Enfance Maghreb Avenir (EMA)** is an officially recognized nonprofit organization that works in partnership with the Moroccan Ministry of Education in 20 public schools, serving 17,000 children. Following the joint initiatives call for projects, Mécénat Servier awarded €100,000 to EMA for the renovation of the training and learning center in Nouasseur, a few kilometers from the Casablanca airport. This second chance school accommodates sixty students between the ages of 15 and 20 who had dropped out of school.

Beyond the financial support that is essential for this type of project, skills-based sponsorship makes it possible to engage Servier Morocco employees and have them shape the future of the country. This collective commitment is the most beautiful gesture that we can witness. The company not only commits financially, but it also commits its people. I am convinced that in order to change the world, we must change people. That's why when a partner commits at the human level, it's very powerful.

Bouchra: The profound alignment of values and objectives between Mécénat Servier and EMA is, in my opinion, the key to the success of such a project. This shared vision allows us to join forces to offer quality education to young people who are struggling, by relying on everyone's active commitment and involvement.

Were you impressed by a particular encounter during this project?

Bouchra: I was deeply impressed by our interactions with students from the first school to which we contributed. They took great interest in the site visits and our discussions about health-related professions. It is very gratifying to see that these conversations allowed them to discover the professional world up close and that they were welcomed very positively. These successful experiences encouraged us to replicate such initiatives with the group from this new second chance school.

Najate: The desire to learn from some of the beneficiaries of *Enfance Maghreb Avenir* is a driving force that inspires me regularly. Recently, I was impressed by the determination of a 25-year-old mother to join the second chance school. Her husband's strict condition was that she wear a headscarf when entering the school, although she does not wear it on a daily basis. She agreed to put aside her beliefs to get through it and learn: "It's just a scarf, but it can save my future." The sacrifice made by this young woman in order to succeed is a source of inspiration for me. Finally, I would like to extend my warm thanks to all the people at Servier who contributed to this project. They have changed the lives of many young people and I believe the reverse is true as well. This chain of support must encourage us to lend a hand. ☺

Skills-based sponsorship, an impactful approach

By offering employees the opportunity to invest work hours toward the public interest, skills-based sponsorship is a worthwhile tool for the company's corporate social responsibility (CSR) commitment. This initiative makes it possible to offer know-how and professional expertise to public interest organizations, to create local connections in the field and to meet the need for meaning and commitment expressed by employees.

Skills-based sponsorship is one of the ways Servier Group employees can get involved. A vital tool for the company's CSR commitment, it offers employees the opportunity to invest in the public interest during work hours. In place since 2017, it allows employees in France two days, then four days per year (two days offered by the company for two days of comp time or paid leave) to use to commit to public interest organizations. Internationally, local managers are free to organize these days of solidarity as they wish.

In October 2023, Mécénat Servier announced the launch of a senior skills-based sponsorship program. This marks a new step in the Group's philanthropic commitment and allows eligible employees to make a smooth transition to retirement while being fully immersed in a public interest organization. Through this arrangement, Mécénat Servier means to strengthen its ties with the nonprofit world, and, above all, to generate a positive social impact by supplying expert employees who desire to share their professional experience. The organizations they work with benefit from new full-time personnel for an extended period of time.

Mécénat Servier works alongside *Alliance pour le Mécénat de compétences*, whose leadership Corinne Massin took over in January 2023. Corinne Massin and Isabelle Million tell us about the organization's vocation and purpose.

What is the vocation of the *Alliance pour le Mécénat de compétences*?

Isabelle Million: The *Alliance pour le Mécénat de compétences* aims to promote skills-based sponsorship in all its forms. AMC is therefore more than ever central to the commitment

ecosystem because it offers a winning relationship for all parties: the company, the employee and the organization. Faced with the multiple challenges society is dealing with, businesses have a role to play alongside public authorities. And thanks to the expertise and collective energy of their employees, they can play a significant role in furthering the public interest.

What are the benefits of skills-based sponsorship for stakeholders?

Isabelle: In 2022, together with Pro Bono Lab, the AMC conducted a collaborative social impact study on

skills-based sponsorship focused on organizations. The idea was to gain a better understanding of their feelings and measure the impact of this approach on their projects and their beneficiaries. Out of the organizations surveyed, 93% believe that skills-based sponsorship has given them access to additional resources and 69% of them consider that it meets their expectations for additional resources.

Corinne Massin: This study has contributed a great deal to the **AMC** roadmap, but also to my thinking as General Delegate of Mécénat Servier. We were starting from the assumption that supporting an organization must necessarily mean financial support and skills-based sponsorship. It is essential to always take the time to fully understand the needs of our organizational partners in order to best meet their expectations.

Have you been impressed by one or more significant encounters within the AMC?

Corinne: The idea of interaction is at the very heart of the *Alliance pour le Mécénat de compétences*. By joining the AMC, Mécénat Servier gained precious time in its thought process thanks to the possibility of sharing experiences with fellow members.

Isabelle: The AMC holds regular meetings between its members, in the context of working groups or events open to a wider audience. One example is the Presidents' Summit, which brings together the leaders of AMC member companies, including Olivier Laureau, President of Servier. In addition, we endeavor to develop our advocacy mission by working with public authorities.

What are the next steps for the AMC?

Isabelle: We would like to step up our activities to spread the skills-based sponsorship program. Companies of all sizes are welcome to join this movement — a particularly relevant one at a time when people are seeking meaning and engagement.

Corinne: The AMC is in the process of developing a charter for impactful skills-based sponsorship. It will lay down principles for reflection and ethical conduct for its members, as well as for all companies that wish to embark on this path. The charter will be disseminated widely throughout our ecosystem to “promote skills-based sponsorship with a useful impact on society and contribute to its development and professionalization by relying on sharing good practices and pooling resources.” This is the AMC’s raison d’être. ☺



- The project is carried out in partnership with other partners
- The funding allocated by Mécénat Servier must not exceed 25% of the organization's total budget
- The nonprofit proposes relevant skills-based sponsorship missions close to Servier's global sites or that can be done remotely

APPENDIX

On the balance sheet for the year ended September 30, 2023, for which a total of €10,574,716, and on the income statement for the financial year, presented in the form of a list, for which total revenues of €3,043,364.

The financial year is 12 months from October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023.

The Mécénat Servier Charity Fund was created in November 2016, and its purpose is to promote, participate in or carry out, directly or indirectly, any initiative, project or activity of public interest in France or abroad in the fields of health, research, social issues relating to living together, education and any cultural activities, in any form whatsoever.

EVENTS CHARACTERIZING THE FINANCIAL YEAR

During the previous financial year, at September 30, 2022 *Les Laboratoires Servier* had paid to the Mécénat Servier Charity Fund a sum of €12 million to be allocated to humanitarian projects in Ukraine. In this context, the Mécénat Servier Charity Fund paid in particular during financial year 2022/2023: €1,200,000 to the [French Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs Corporate Solidarity Fund](#), €118,215 to the [Fédération Nationale de Protection Civile](#) and €157,458 to the organization [KRONA](#).

Following the earthquake in Turkey, the Mécénat Servier Charity Fund made a contribution of €506,429 to the social cooperative [Needs Map](#). This aid was financed by €500,000 of exceptional funding granted by *Les Laboratoires Servier* and by €3,214 of donations received from Servier Group employees worldwide, matched by the Charity Fund.

ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES APPLIED

The annual accounts for the financial year are presented in accordance with French accounting regulations:

- ANC 2014-03 et seq. relating to the rewriting of the applicable general accounting plan at the end of the financial year;
- ANC 2018-06 relating to the annual accounts of nonprofit private legal entities.

The general accounting conventions were applied, in accordance with the principle of prudence, and in accordance with basic accounting assumptions:

- Going Concern;
- Independence of financial years;
- Consistency of accounting policies from year to year.

CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

None

ADDITIONAL GENERAL INFORMATION

As the endowment of the Charity Fund is consumable, in accordance with the Articles of Association, the terms of consumption are determined by the Board of Directors.

At the beginning of the financial year, equity showed a new carry-over credit of €12,039,193. Donations received by the Charity Fund between October 2022 and September 2023 totaled €1,553,564. They were allocated as consumable allocations.

Donations from the Charity Fund, as well as its operating costs, amounted to €3,043,364 over the period. This amount has been recognized in the profit and loss statement account and in the "Consumable allocations recorded in the profit and loss statement" account.

This results in equity at the end of the financial year of €10,549,394, which will be used to finance humanitarian projects in Ukraine.

The Charity Fund granted a total of €2,950,644 in contributions for the financial year 2022/2023, following decisions made by the Board of Directors. More information is presented in the "Details of donations granted" section.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS IN KIND

In accordance with ANC Regulation no. 2018-06, voluntary contributions in kind are accounted for with the following methods of identification, quantification and valuation:
